

WP Auto Blogger Plugin Documentation: API Config Tab

Welcome to the **API Config** tab documentation for WP Auto Blogger. Below, you'll find a breakdown of each field, what it does, and how to configure it for the best results. This tab is essential for integrating the OpenAI API, which powers the content generation features of WP Auto Blogger.



1. OpenAl API Key

What it is: This is the unique API key provided by OpenAI that allows WP Auto Blogger to access and interact with the OpenAI GPT model.

What it does: The API key connects your WordPress site to OpenAl's servers, enabling the generation of AI-powered content based on the prompts you provide.

How to use it:

Visit OpenAI and sign up or log in.

Go to the API section and create a new API key.

Copy the key and paste it into this field.

Important: Ensure your OpenAI account has sufficient funds or billing enabled to cover API usage.

2. Model

What it is: The AI model you select will determine the type and complexity of the generated content.

What it does: This field allows you to choose which OpenAI model WP Auto Blogger will use to generate posts. Different models vary in size, speed, and capability.

How to use it:

Choose between available models like GPT-3.5 or GPT-4 Turbo depending on your needs.

For most use cases, GPT-4 Turbo provides more advanced and detailed results, making it a great choice for generating high-quality blog content.

Make sure the model you select matches your usage plan and API key permissions.

3. Max Tokens

What it is: Tokens represent pieces of words or characters. Max Tokens limit how much text the model generates.

What it does: This field determines the maximum length of the generated content. A higher number of tokens means longer posts, while a lower number generates shorter text.

How to use it:

Set this field based on the desired length of your blog posts. For example, 300-500 tokens would generate a medium-length post.

Keep in mind that longer outputs use more API resources, so balance content length with your OpenAI budget.

Recommendation: Start with 500 tokens for medium-length blog posts and adjust based on your content needs.

4. Temperature

What it is: Temperature controls the randomness and creativity of the AI's responses. It adjusts how "creative" or "predictable" the generated content is.

What it does: Higher values (up to 1) make the output more creative and diverse, while lower values (closer to 0) make the content more focused and deterministic.

How to use it:

High Creativity (0.7 - 1.0): Set a higher temperature if you want the content to be more imaginative, great for creative writing or varied blog topics.

Focused Content (0 - 0.3): Use a lower temperature for more factual, straightforward content where creativity is less important.

Recommendation: Start with a temperature around 0.7 for a balanced mix of creativity and coherence.

5. Frequency Penalty

What it is: Frequency Penalty reduces the likelihood of the model repeating the same lines or phrases within the content.

What it does: This setting discourages the model from using repetitive words or phrases, helping to ensure the content is varied and unique.

How to use it:

A higher frequency penalty (up to 2) results in less repetition, ideal for generating diverse and engaging posts.

A lower frequency penalty (closer to 0) allows more repetition, which can be useful for structured content like product descriptions or FAQs.

Recommendation: Set it between 0.5 and 1.0 to keep content fresh without over-restricting the model.

6. Presence Penalty

What it is: Presence Penalty influences the likelihood of the AI introducing new topics or ideas into the content.

What it does: A higher presence penalty encourages the model to explore new content and topics, while a lower value keeps the text focused on existing themes.

How to use it:

A higher presence penalty (up to 2) will introduce more varied topics and concepts, great for exploratory or creative writing.


A lower presence penalty (closer to 0) will make the model stick to the original topic more strictly, perfect for informative or topic-specific posts.

Recommendation: Set this around 0.5 for most blog posts to encourage a balanced exploration of topics without going off-track.

The API Config tab is critical for fine-tuning how WP Auto Blogger generates your content. By adjusting these settings, you can control the length, creativity, and focus of your Algenerated posts. Be sure to experiment with different configurations to find what works best for your specific blogging needs.

WP Auto Blogger Plugin Documentation: General Settings Tab

The General Settings tab allows you to configure key details about your site and control how WP Auto Blogger interacts with you through email notifications. These settings help tailor the plugin's content generation to match your website's identity and ensure you're kept up-to-date on important actions.



1. Site Name

What it is: The name of your website, as it will appear in AI-generated content and email notifications.

What it does: The site name helps the plugin generate content that aligns with your brand by incorporating your site's identity into the posts.

How to use it:

Enter the full name of your website or blog (e.g., "WP Auto Blogger").

This field is essential for ensuring the AI references your site appropriately within the content it creates.

Tip: Keep the name consistent with your branding across your site and marketing materials.

2. Site Description

What it is: A brief summary of what your website or business is about.

What it does: This description gives the AI context for generating relevant content tailored to your niche or industry.

How to use it:

Enter a concise description of your site, focusing on your core services, products, or blog topics (e.g., "We specialize in WordPress plugins and automated content creation").

The site description will guide the AI in creating content that aligns with your website's theme and goals.

Recommendation: Make sure the description is clear and specific, as this will help the AI understand the purpose and audience of your site.

3. Email Notifications

What it is: This setting controls whether or not you receive email notifications from WP Auto Blogger about important events, such as post generation or errors.



Here's a detailed explanation of each field in this tab and how to configure them for optimal results.



1. Default Featured Image

What it is: This is the image that will be used as the featured image for blog posts when no specific image is provided or generated.

What it does: If the AI-generated post doesn't have an image, WP Auto Blogger will automatically assign this default featured image to ensure your posts remain visually appealing.

How to use it:

Upload a high-quality image that represents your brand or blog.

This image will appear on all posts without specific imagery, maintaining a consistent look for your blog.

Tip: Choose an image that is generic enough to suit various blog topics but still aligns with your brand's style.

2. Image Provider

What it is: This option allows you to choose from different image providers, such as Pexels and Unsplash, to automatically pull high-quality images into your blog posts.

What it does: When an image provider is selected, WP Auto Blogger will fetch relevant images to match the content of each generated post.

How to use it:

None: No images will be fetched, and only the default featured image will be used if specified.

Pexels: Select this option to pull free images from the Pexels image database.

Unsplash: Select this option to pull free images from the Unsplash image database.

Recommendation: Choose either Pexels or Unsplash to automatically integrate beautiful, high-resolution images that enhance your blog content.

3. Provide API Key

What it is: This field is required when using image providers like Pexels or Unsplash. It enables the plugin to fetch images from their respective APIs.

What it does: The API key gives WP Auto Blogger access to the image databases of Pexels or Unsplash, allowing the plugin to download relevant images for each post.



1. Enable SEO Optimization (On/Off Toggle)







4. Actions (View and Delete)

How to use it:


View: Click the View button to open and preview the post. This is useful for checking content quality, structure, and SEO settings before publishing or editing.

WP Auto Blogger Plugin Documentation: License Page

The License page is where you manage your subscription by entering and activating your license key. This key is required to unlock and use all the features of WP Auto Blogger. Once activated, the license allows you to continue generating posts and using the plugin as part of your subscription plan.



1. License Key

What it is: The unique code you receive when you purchase your WP Auto Blogger subscription.

What it does: The license key verifies your subscription and unlocks the full functionality of WP Auto Blogger.

How to use it:

Retrieve your license key by logging into your WP Auto Blogger account: https://wpautoblogger.co.uk/my-account.

Copy the license key from your account page.

Paste the key into the License Key field on the License page of the plugin.

2. Activate License
